Recipe

As we seem to have a glut of Citrus fruit at the moment I thought it would be helpful to have a couple of recipes to make full use of our bounty.

Egg-less Lemon Spread

makes 11/4 cups

1/2 cup milk
1/4 cup water
1 tbsp corn flour
6 tbsp sugar
6 tbsp fresh lemon juice
1 teaspoon lemon zest
5 tbsp unsalted butter
pinch of salt
optional: 1/8 teaspoon lemon extract



Directions:

- 1. Dissolve the corn flour in the cold milk and water
- 2. Turn heat to medium-high and continuously stir the mixture.
- 3. Add in the butter, lemon juice and sugar and continue to stir until mixture starts to bubble and thicken.
- 4. Reduce heat to low and beat with a hand-held beater for about 90 seconds.
- 5. Transfer mixture to sterile jar, seal, & refrigerate when chilled.
- 6. Store in fridge and use within 2-3 weeks.

Citrus Cleaner

Here's what you need:

Peels from 3-5 oranges or 6-8 mandarins. A litre of distilled white vinegar A one-litre glass jar with a good seal lid. Empty spray bottle



Here's what to do:

Fill the jar with the peels. Pour in enough vinegar to fill the jar to the top: Put lid on tightly and let sit for **10 days**. After 10 days, strain out peels.

Pour into an empty spray bottle, and use to clean your counters, bathrooms, floors, or pretty much anything you like.

The cleaner itself still has a vinegar scent to it, but once sprayed and wiped with a towel, the smell completely disappears!

Have you ever tried Mandarin juice? *It is quiet yummy....* cut it in half & squeeze like an orange. If you would like it a bit tartier try adding some lemon juice.

THE MOHS HARDNESS SCALE for minerals has been used since 1822. It simply consists of 10 minerals arranged in order from 1 to 10. Diamond is rated as the hardest and is indexed as 10; talc as the softest with index number 1. Each mineral in the scale will scratch all those below it as follows:

Mohs Hardness Chart							
Diamond	10	Corundum	9				
Topaz	8	Quartz	7				
Feldspar	6	Apatite	5				
Fluorite	4	Calcite	3				
Gypsum	2	Talc	1
