Workshop News



Ron Dean conducted a silversmith class on Saturday 22nd June 2013

On Saturday 22nd June we had a workshop on making a Silver Bracelet. Suzy, Don, Lil and Carolyna attended. Ron was the teacher.

Upon arrival Ron introduced us to a machine for making silver jump rings. This was a very useful piece of technology as it is quite expensive to buy sterling silver jump rings in the quantity needed for the bracelet.

What you do is you stick the silver wire into the chuck of the winder and then start winding. Amazingly enough a spring forms and when you have enough rings on it, you stop winding. That is when the fun starts. You then have to put the 'spring' into a vice and saw across the top of the spiral. After much work sawing (and holding your tongue in the right place) a whole lot of open jump rings fall out of the vice.

The bracelet needed three different sized jump rings and I was very glad Ron had gone to the trouble of preparing most of them for us. I was very impressed when I connected all the rings for the first row. I was expecting to be told to put a clasp on it, but I found out that we had two more rows to go. It really is a chain mail type bracelet.

I thought it was hard work making the jump rings until I had to make the clasp. The clasp is a really clever and simple idea, you just bend some thick silver wire into a hook shape and you have a readymade clasp. My delicate girly musician hands found it pretty hard to bend the wire, so thanks Ron for helping me with mine.

Ron was very patient with us as we joined the jump rings together (sometimes in the wrong place). The bracelet was a great choice for a Saturday workshop as it wasn't too hard and we had enough time to finish it. I have been proudly wearing mine everywhere.

I must mention that while we were busily working away on our bracelets, John, Clarice and Elaine were making the book marks for our annual exhibition. They look great, make sure you collect a few to give to people. They are a really good marketing strategy.

Recipe

Sophia Loren's Spaghetti Sauce
