## **Aquamarine - March Birthstone**

Aquamarine is one of the official birthstones for March. Aquamarine is a blue to green-blue type of precious beryl. The beryl group of minerals is well known for its chromium-rich, green emerald .Aquamarine is very hard and has an outstanding glass-like lustre. It can range from light blue to dark blue. The name 'Aquamarine' comes from a Latin word which meaning 'seawater'.

Although Aquamarine and emerald belong to the same family, but they are quite different. Aquamarine and emerald are both beryllium aluminium silicates. While emerald is coloured by trace amounts of chromium (and vanadium), Aquamarine's colour is the result of iron impurities within colourless beryl crystal. Aquamarine and emerald have essentially the same specific gravity and refractive index, but emerald tends to be hazy and full of inclusions, while Aquamarine has excellent transparency and clarity. Aquamarine, and other types of beryl, are quite durable and hard, ranging from 7.5 to 8 on Mohs scale of mineral hardness. A dark and deeply-saturated blue is the most desirable and valuable Aquamarine colour. Other varieties of beryl include



Morganite, Goshenite, Golden Beryl (Heliodor), Green Beryl and Bixbite. It has a six-sided crystal structure.

#### **Aquamarine Treatment**

Aquamarine is often heat-treated for color enhancement, but many are untreated. Heating at low temperatures will reduce unwanted green and yellowish tones. Darker shades of aquamarine are almost always heated, as well as lower quality stones (Usually at 400-450C) in order to enhance the color into a favorable blue color. Heating at higher

temperatures would result in discoloration.

PLEOCHROIC: weak BIRTHSTONE FOR: March

COLOR: various shades of blue to blue-green.

INDEX OF REFRACTION: 1.57 - 1.60 BIREFRINGENCE: 0.004 - 0.008

HARDNESS: 7.5 - 8 STREAK: White

Suzy Brandstater was the teacher for the workshop




# **Bench tips**

#### **NO - MAR PLIERS**

Pliers can often leave nicks and scratches on your work. If this is giving you a problem, first take a close look at the plier jaws. New tools can be a little rough. I typically relieve any sharp edges, sand away any tool marks and give working areas a quick polish.

If that doesn't solve the problem, you probably need to cover the jaws. Plastic electrical tape provides a quick fix but can leave messy adhesive on the jaws. Dips don't seem to last very long. A quick and easy way I've found is to slip a length of 1/8 dia vinyl tubing over each jaw. It's quick and leaves no sticky residue. Only problem is that it increases the size of the plier jaws a bit. The tubing can be found in a store that sells aquarium supplies.
