Stone of the Month - Lodolite Quartz

This month I would like to talk about Lodolite Quartz. It is also known as scenic quartz and garden quartz. It is also called included quartz.

Lodolite is a term used for a verity of quartz with mineral inclusions, from Minas Gerais, Brazil. In (Greek) Lodolite means mud stone or stone from the mud. Were not too sure this term applies, all that well to Lodolite. Because Lodolite has the appearance of an underwater coral reef or a garden. The mineral inclusions are very attractive and differ from stone to stone. The colours of the inclusions can range

from green, pink, yellow, brown, white, red and multi colours. Most of these colours and mixes of colours. Come from three main types of minerals, Chlorite, Iron, and calcite.

Quartz includes a variety of stones and colourless, or crystal quartz is the most common. Brazil is a major supplier of crystal quartz. Especially when it comes to verities with mineral inclusions. Quartz is found abundantly throughout the world. The word "crystal" comes from the Greek word for "ice" and was believed to be eternally frozen. The single quartz crystal is a six-sided prism, however this is not always how it is formed. Sometimes it is found in veins, seams, or pockets containing the massive variety.

Handling: Quartz is sensitive to heat. Be careful during soldering. Sensitive to hydrofluoric acid only. Quartz has no or only very weak cleavage and thus is unproblematic during setting.

Trade name for Quartz with mineral inclusions of the Chlorite group. According to the type of Chlorite, the very attractive inclusions appear in various colours like green, brown, orange, white, pink, or purple.

Like regular quartz, the chemical composition of lodolite quartz is silicon dioxide (SiO2). Plus whatever minerals are in the inclusion.

I haven't included Phantom quartz and rutilated quartz in this article. I will talk about them next month.

Lodolite is often called garden quartz, landscape quartz, or scenic quartz. It's often used in meditation practices. Another metaphysical use of lodolite is to bring energies to effect manifestation of one's desires. Lodolite is also said to enhance communication with beings on the spiritual plane and heighten one's spiritual energies. It is used mystically to increase ESP and bring knowledge from your past lives. Lodolite is a great dreaming crystal. Lodolite is said to bring loving energies and energies of gentle strength. Mystically and in crystal healing, lodolite is purported to be an excellent healing stone bringing strong healing energies and energetic shifting so that healing will occur.

Chlorite is one of the most universal and favorable healing minerals. Used by chlorite in crystal has been used by shamans for powerful healings and cleansings.

Meditation (by looking into the scene within the crystal) brings the gentle strength of earth into one's life. An excellent healing and energy shifting stone, lodalite with chlorite and calcite, allows one to explore the mysteries of life and allow "nature" to unfold in an easy fashion for the highest good of all. This is a good crystal to place on your desktop or alter or anywhere indoors to remind you of the wonders of nature and your ability to manifest your desires within your life.

Brad Smith's Bench Tips

Sanding/polishing in tight places

Often you'll need to sand or polish an area that's impossible to reach with even a small wheel on a flexshaft. Other times it might be the bottom of a pocket or inside

bottom corner of a box that needs to be finished. One trick for these nit-picky jobs may be left over from your last Chinese dinner - a chopstick I've found quite a few uses for these in the shop. Prepare the tip by simply sawing it off at a 45 degree angle. Then apply whatever abrasive grit you will need for the job or hold a strip of sandpaper around the end. Loose grit can be held onto the tip with a bit of vaseline or oil. Tripoli or rouge can be just rubbed onto the end of the chopstick

Ochre Applicator



Yellow ochre is used when you want to be sure the solder won't flow on an area of your piece while you're soldering another area. The only problem with ochre is coming up with a good way to store and apply it.

I use recycled nail polish bottles. They seal well and have a built-in brush applicator. Just clean them out with a little acetone or nail polish remover, and they're ready to go.
